## *Proposed Daphne Street Bikeway Improvements Pine Street to Sequoia Street in Valley Springs, CA*

The purpose of the meeting will be to brief abutting residents and businesses on a proposed bikepath improvement project primarily funded by proceeds of the California Bicycle Transportation Account.

The County's project proposal is being presented at this public meeting in order to advise project stakeholders of the manner and duration of the proposed improvement work and to receive public input.



The project funding was awarded as a result of a successful grant application for bike and pedestrian safety improvements at the Daphne Street location within the Valley Springs community. The type of work to be performed under this project includes street pavement widening, signing and striping of a Class II bike lane along both sides of the existing roadway between Pine Street and Rose Street, and a detached Class I asphalt bikeway facility between Rose Street and Sequoia Street. Related improvements include a new 4-way STOP sign traffic control at the Rose Street intersection and various drainage related improvements.

All proposed improvement work will occur within the County's existing street right-of-way. Parking and access to abutting properties will periodically be affected during construction, and affected properties will receive advance notification of these impacts and restrictions. The County will coordinate with the US Postal Service to assure that impacts on mail delivery are minimized. Stakeholders are also advised that the existing manner and capability for on-street vehicle parking will be permanently modified or eliminated at various locations within the project limits as a result of the street widening.

The construction work will be performed by County crews and is anticipated to start by mid September and be completed by the end of the year.
